

## LESSON 5 – GOD IS OFFENDED

### WORDS TO KNOW:

**Sin:** Any wrong that we do. Sin turns us away from God. Sin is to disobey God’s law.

**Original sin:** The sin committed by ADAM and EVE.

**To offend:** Sin offends God which means sin makes God sad.

**Angel:** Spirits made by God. Angels are God’s helpers.

**Devils:** Bad angels who went against (disobeyed) God.

**To Obey:** To do what we are told. We should obey God’s law.

## **THE PARABLE OF THE LOST SHEEP (Luke 15:1-7)**

**Q.1. How many sheep did the shepherd have?**
