QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

1. What caused Paul and Barnabas to travel to Lystra and Derbe? (Acts 14:05-6)
Answer: They fled the efforts of both Jews and Gentiles to abuse and stone them.
2. What prompted Paul to heal the crippled man from birth in Lystra? (Acts 14:09)
Answer: Paul saw that the man had faith to be healed.

Fill in the blank in St. Paul's words: "But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard this, they tore their clothes and ran in among the multitude, crying out and saying, 'Men, why are you doing these things?
